Decoding Your Auto Schedule

When you look at your Auto Schedule, you'll notice that we use abbreviations and codes on your Schedule. This document explains the abbreviations and codes you may find on your Schedule.

Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) – This is the unique identifying number for your auto.

Class Code – This is the class that we have assigned your auto to. The codes that you'll find in this column are:

Class Codes	Description
PASS01TO08	Autos that hold 1-8 passengers that are used for student transportation (even if occasional).
PASS09TO20	Autos that hold 9-20 passengers that are used for student transportation (even if occasional).
PASS21TO60	Autos that hold 21-60 passengers that are used for student transportation.
PASSOVER60	Autos that hold 61 and more passengers that are used for student transportation.
PRIVATEPASS	Autos that are not used for student transportation and are not trucks, vans or maintenance vehicles. For example, an auto that can be checked out by your staff to take to a professional development meeting or to another location.
TRUCKMAINT	Maintenance autos and vans that not used for student transportation and all trucks (even if the truck is used for student transportation).
DRIVERTRG	Drivers Education autos
MOTORCYCLES	Motorcycles
TRAILER	Trailers

Class Codes	Description
PASS01TO08	Autos that hold 1-8 passengers that are used for student transportation (even if occasional).

PASS21TO60	Autos that hold 21-60 passengers that are used for student transportation.
PASSOVER60	Autos that hold 61 and more passengers that are used for student transportation.
PRIVATEPASS	Autos that are not used for student transportation and are not trucks, vans or maintenance vehicles. For example, an auto that can be checked out by your staff to take to a professional development meeting or to another location.
TRUCKMAINT	Maintenance autos and vans that not used for student transportation and all trucks (even if the truck is used for student transportation).
DRIVERTRG	Drivers Education autos
MOTORCYCLES	Motorcycles
TRAILER	Trailers
